Theoretical Framework

- The meta-theory of social representations (Moscovici, 1976; Jodelet, 1991; de Rosa, 1994)
- The theory of social identity (Tajfel, 1981)
- Self-identity (Breakwell, 1992)
- Social memory related to places (Milgram and Jodelet's seminal study)



The History

- Continuation of cross-national research by Professor de Rosa
- Previous research already done in Rome, Paris, London, Helsinki, Lisbon, Madrid, and Vienna
- Comparison of Paris and Rome, the research done by Professor de Rosa and Marialibera d'Ambrosio



European Capitals





Research

- Location: the city of Warsaw
- Subjects: minimum 30 first visitors of six different nationalities
- Data collection: from November 2009 until September 2010
- The dynamics of the figurative nucleus: before and after seeing the city
- Languages: English, French, German, Italian, Polish and Spanish



Research tool

- The questionnaire developed by Professor de Rosa
- Associative network: Warsaw and ideal city
- Place identity construct of Proshansky (1978) time pattern
- The city of Warsaw and the Old Town free adjectival associations
- Questions before and after seeing the city
- Projective technique drawing a map
- Sources of information about Warsaw informational luggage
- Population variable



Specificity of Warsaw

- Post-communist European capital city
- Destroyed during World War II
- Language difficulty
- Weather conditions
- The year of Chopin
- Event in Smolensk
- Presidential elections
- Very low appeal

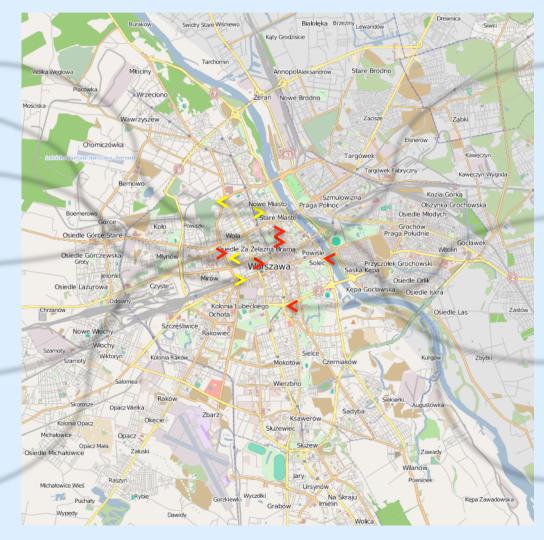
