The best way to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Social Representation Theory has been to announce new-borns, both on the:
 - a) **editorial initiatives** – Italian edition of *La Psychoanalyse*, launch of dedicated book series, edited books in Brasil and in Italy, Special Issues of *Journal for the Theory of the Social Behavior* and of *Papers on Social Representations*
 - b) **Research on Opera Prima** – the follow-up and extension of the first-wave research

This fertility of the theory allows Denise Jodelet (2008) to qualify it as “*A Beautiful Invention*”

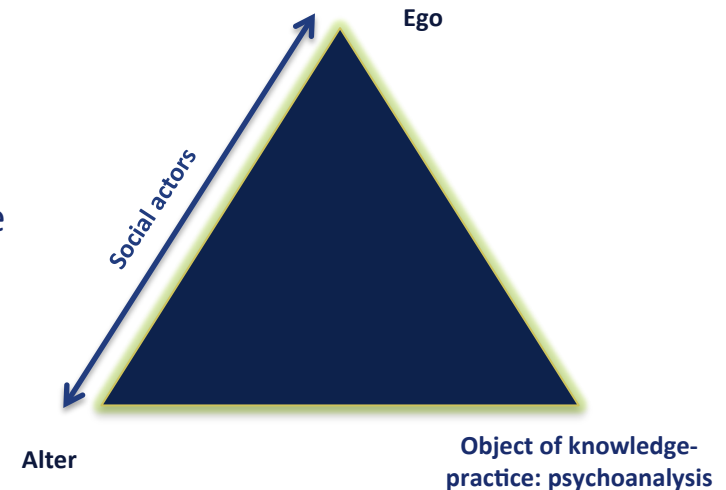


The Follow-up of Moscovici's Opera Prima (1961, 1976) in the era of Facebook

A special opportunity to study the **stability and possible transformations in social representations**, given the evolution occurred not only in the three apexes (Subject-Other-Object) of the epistemic triangle, but also in the relevant socio-historical, ideological and communicative contexts

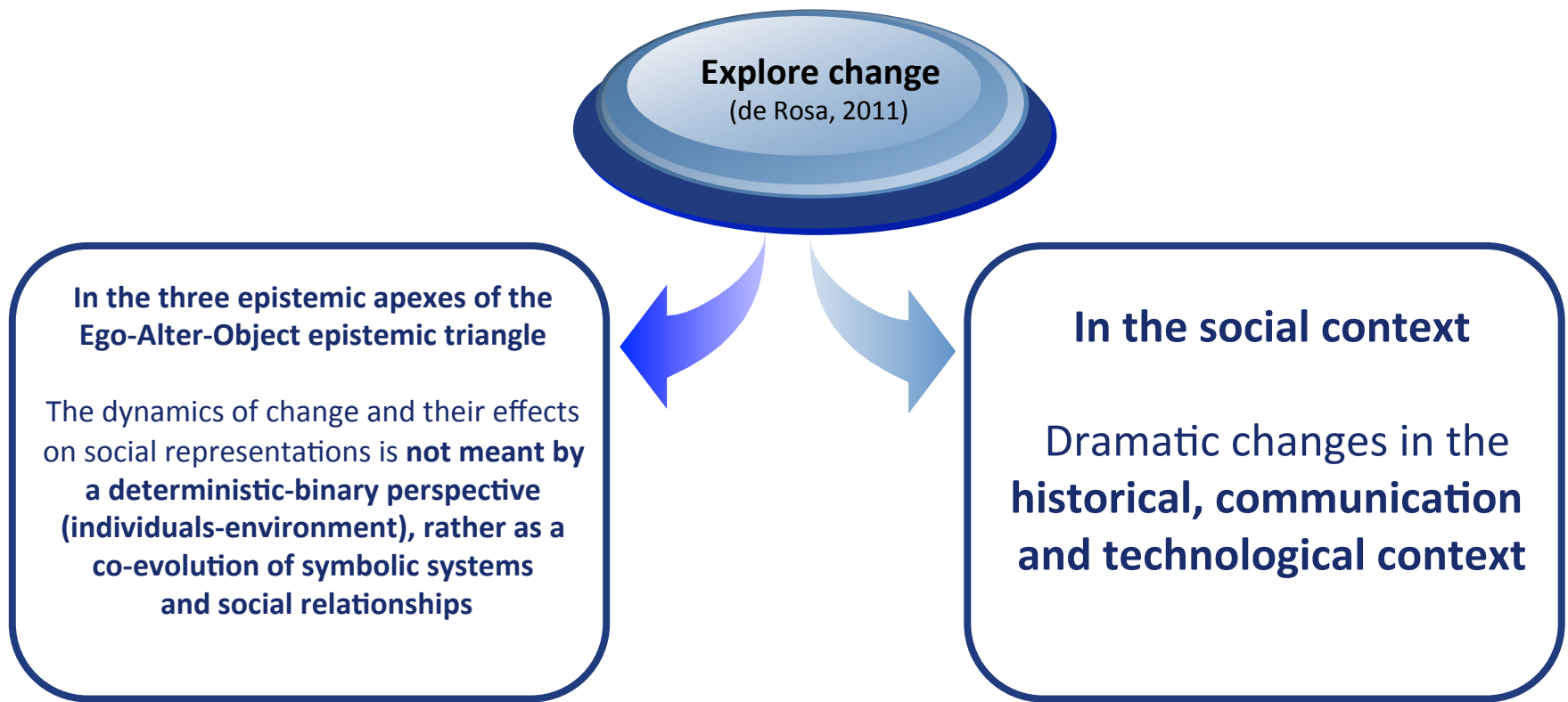
Regarding the three apexes of the Epistemic Triangle, changes have occurred:

- a) In the development of the '**object**' of knowledge-practice itself: psychoanalysis
- b) In the **social actors involved** (Subject-Other)
- c) In the **socio-historical and communicative context**

Co-evolution of changes in the Epistemic Triangle

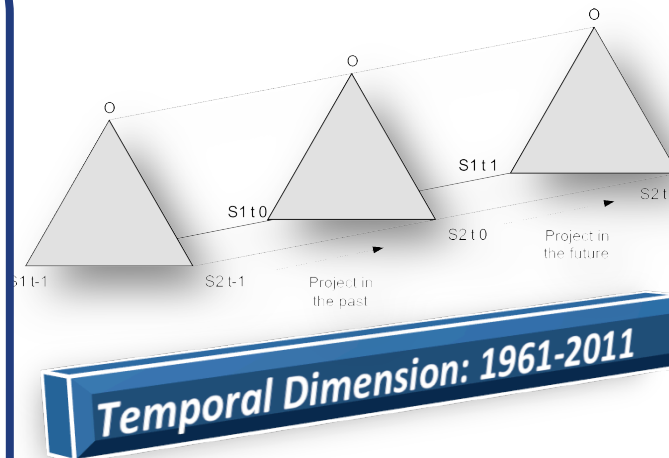
Analyzing the evolution of the apexes of the epistemic triangle (S-O-S) along a temporal dimension (S-O-P-S; Bauer & Gaskell, 1999), it was possible to identify:

Following-up Moscovici's seminal study

Given the hypothesized **co-evolution of social representations** and the above-mentioned **fundamental axe of changes**, the follow-up could no consist in a mere **cloning of the baseline research**

We necessarily had to harmonize the need for **“replicability” of the seminal study with the introduction of innovative elements tailored on new research objectives** (new data collection and analysis techniques, if compared to the original notebook-questionnaire)

In the same vein, significant structural **extension were introduced, in terms of research tools, samples, geo-cultural contexts of interest, media system, objects of representations**

Moscovici himself, in 1976, highlighted the need to follow-up the study, with special regard to the analysis of communication systems



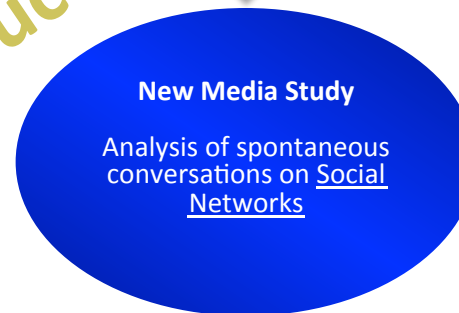
The Modeling Approach

Aiming at capturing the dynamic inter-relation among different representational systems, we found that a multi-paradigmatic and multi-method integration were not enough, as a simple stratification based on different theoretical, methodological, empirical perspectives, could not cover the complexity of social reality (de Rosa, 1990)

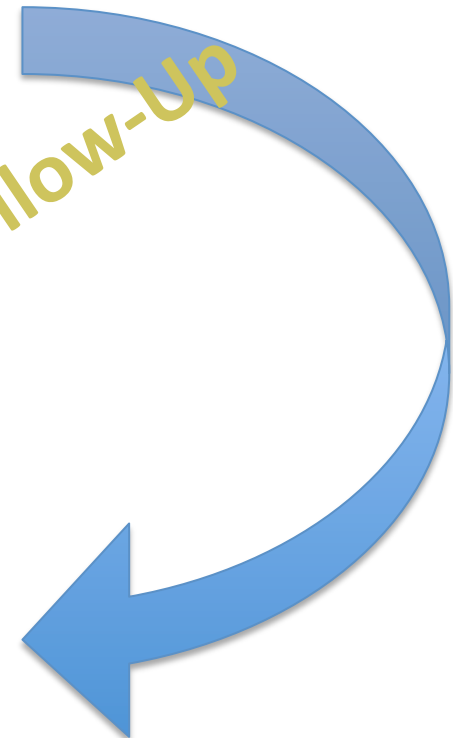
The modelling approach (1987a, 1987b, 1990, 1991, 1993, 1994a, 1994b, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2002, 2006a, 2006b, 2006c, 2009, 2012; de Rosa, Bocci, & Pedreira, 2012; de Rosa, d'Ambrosio, & Cohen, 2005; de Rosa & d'Ambrosio, 2008; de Rosa & Farr, 2001; de Rosa, Mormino, Rosa, Bellelli, & Bakhurst, 2000) represented a fundamental epistemological option for the present follow-up, relying on the interconnected continuum between theoretical, methodological, and empirical perspectives, in which the choice of methods, samples, and the interpretation of results is supposed to follow specific pre-defined hypothesis and research objectives

The Field Study



Research Objectives

- Analyze the co-evolution of inter-related systems of representations along a temporal perspective (1961-2011)
- Study the content and the structure of the representations related to the objects of analysis
- Study the transformations regarding the social actors involved
- Examine cultural similarities and differences between the two contexts investigated



Research Tool

We reformulated the original notebook-questionnaire created by Moscovici, accurately extracted by a comparative analysis of the book-editions of *la Psychanalyse* (Moscovici, 1961, 1976; see de Rosa, 2011a). Eventually, a **semi-structured interview was elaborated and added to the final notebook-questionnaire, including the following investigation tools:**

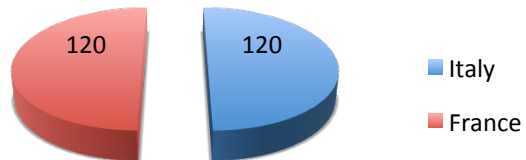
- **associative networks (verbal stimuli: psychoanalysis, psychiatry, illness, mental illness, normality, deviance)**
- **semantic self-identification conceptual network**
- **semantic conceptual identification network (verbal stimuli: psychoanalysis, psychiatry, psychoanalyst, psychiatrist)**
- **5-point Likert scales**
- **Open-ended questions**
- **Multiple choice questions**

Interviews were administrated by interviewers specifically trained in the context of the European/ International Joint PhD on Social Representations and Communications Research Centre and Multimedia Lab, **from January 2011 to January 2012, in Italy and France** (Rome, Paris, and several provinces)

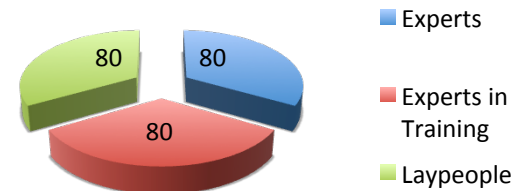

A selection of results: Psychoanalysis, psychiatry, their protagonists and publics: exploring representational fields through Multiple Correspondence Analysis

Besides a simply descriptive approach to data, we applied a **Multiple Correspondence Analysis** (MCA), defining the set of *active variables*, i.e. concurring to the determination of factors, vs. a second group of variables, excluded from the factorial matrix, to be considered as **illustrative**, i.e. **clarifying the meaning of factors and subjects-groups' positioning on the representational space**.

Subsequently, through the elaboration of the contingency matrix on the set of active variables, the extraction of factors is realized, allowing to **synthesize the latent structure of relations among variables**.



MCA

199 ACTIVE VARIABLES and 994 modalities related to the image of psychoanalysis and psychiatry and focusing on the following domains: **definition and goals, knowledge of the disciplines and their thematic languages, attitudes, implications with sexuality, religion, and ideologies, diffusion, publics, efficacy, influence on personality, image of the psychoanalyst and the psychiatrist, and the forms of relationship and communication with patients.**

11 descriptive and socio-demographic ILLUSTRATIVE VARIABLES (41 modalities): population, age, gender, social-working status, education, political orientation, religious belief, orientation, faith, and practice. Data were preliminarily codified in order to group modalities in valid frequency classes (e.g. classes of age).

MCA – Data Analysis

ACM was conducted by means of SPAD-T (v. 5.0), specifically through the CORMU procedure. The maximum number of dimensions considered corresponded to the minimum ratio between the total number of categories minus the number of valid (no missing data) active variables, and the number of observations minus one. The final solution was however limited to the top-dimensions identified (see Di Franco, 2001).

239 factorial axes were extracted, with 2.7857 total amount of eigenvalues. Nevertheless, according to Benzècri (1979; cfr. Greenacre, 1984) the binary codifying system implicit in the elaboration of the Burt matrix supports a pessimistic estimation of the proportion of inertia provided by the ACM, i.e. an underestimation of the Variablesty explained by the factorial asses. Hence, we applied Benzècri's procedure for the correction of eigenvalues and total inertia.

1. “Disseminating scientific knowledge”: the sources of information on psychoanalysis and psychiatry

S+ This factor is characterized by references to **sources of scientific information**. In the positive semi-axis, in particular, the focus is on time dedicated to each of these **sources**: *friends* (4.38) and *relatives* (3.92) seem to hold a major position, stressing the role of everyday interaction and conversation in the process of information diffusion, through the incessant translation between the reified and consensual universe (Moscovici, 1961, 1976, 1984). Still, references to **more traditional media as** *radio* (5.06), *cinema* (4.87), *TV* (4.51), and the *press* are present, although new digital media and the social networks represent a significant innovation from the FWR, specifically *forum* (2.88), *facebook* (2.85), *wikipedia* (2.85), *twitter* (2.61), e *youtube* (2.48).

As regards active variables, we found reference to the alleged low (1.07) impact of psychoanalysis on personality, especially of **patients**, or at most corresponding to the ability and skills of the analyst (0.70). This implies a vision of **psychoanalysis as a poorly objective discipline, or at least with low standards in the estimation and reproduction of scientific and clinical outcomes, a “hot” topic** that was just included in the recent international debate on the controversy regarding the scientific status of psychoanalysis both as a theory and practice (Mecacci, 2000; Onfray, 2010).



1. “Disseminating scientific knowledge”: the sources of information on psychoanalysis and psychiatry

S- Within the negative semi-axis, we found responses by **French respondents, mostly residing in Paris** (-4.12), seemingly reproducing the Freudian tension-reduction model characterized by the concepts of *complex* (-3.15) and *sublimation* (-2.43) of subconscious conflicts, although psychiatry is pointed out as responsible of intervening in case of sexual troubles (-2.09).

Therefore, **not surprisingly we found in both cultural contexts a major role attributed to social networks and new online broadcasters in disseminating scientific knowledge, as for *facebook* (-3.39), *twitter* (-4.82), *yahoo! answers* (-4.40), *youtube* (-3.93) and *wikipedia* (-2.33).** In the same vein, also **forum** (-3.50) and **websites** (-3.62) are cited, at the light of the decline of more traditional media, as for *radio* (-2.55) and *tv* (-2.63).

In this regard, the relevance of social networks is specifically evident in the context of everyday communication, disclosing new perspectives related to the dimension of trust/distrust, fundamental premises in the exchange and production of social representations, contributing to redefine traditional borders of scientific and epistemic communities, meeting no longer just in cafés or marketplaces, rather in online social networks (de Rosa, 2012b, p. 5).

2. Psychoanalysis, psychiatry, risks and opportunities

S+ The positive semi-axis provides results mainly referring to **Italian respondents**, (*Rome*: 5.24, *Italian province*: 8.52), **non-experts and with high school education (3.60)**, **mostly labourers (2.43)**. As regards the religious orientation, respondents were not surprisingly **mostly christians** (3.38 – still being the prevalent orientation in Italy), although characterized by **low religious faith (2.85) and practice (2.88)**.

Results, as delineated by the active variables involved, refer to differences emerging from the **comparison between psychoanalytic and psychiatric treatments**. The **psychiatric treatments**, in fact, is remarked to represent a **potential risk** (1.07) of further dissociation for the patients' personality, whereas **the psychiatrist is depicted as distant and poorly personally involved in the treatment** (2.32), if compared with the *psychoanalyst* (1.23). Nevertheless, **psychiatric therapy is perceived as an "objective" as well as "aseptic" kind of treatment, with no implications with sexuality** (1.70). Differently, the relationship to be established between psychoanalyst and patient is described as **spiritual** (1.07), with **no implication with sexuality or the therapist's gender** (1.65). It requires effort and constance, as the **frequency of the treatment is indicated twice per week** (0.98), and **preferably not before 21 y.o.** (0.83), because of the hard personal change required, even better for the adult aged (31-60: 0.72). Finally, it is perceived as **an economically expensive treatment, so that rich people would be the more likely to recur to psychoanalysis** (1.65).



2. Psychoanalysis, psychiatry, risks and opportunities

S- In the negative semi-axis, participants reveal a clearer knowledge on the two disciplines instead, as further supported by **higher levels of information and education**. As regards, expressions as *sublimation* (-5.38), *identification* (-4.61), *thanatos* (-4.53), *missed act* (-3.95), *symbol* (-3.95), *dream* (-3.77), *free associations* (-3.72), *eros* (-3.22), *unconscious* (-3.04), *psychic conflict* (-2.99), *lapsus* (-2.94), *drive* (-2.87), *projection* (-2.85), *ego* (-2.8), *instinct* (-2.71), *neurosis* (-2.68), *preconscious* (-2.12), and *transfert* (-2.03), have been correctly associated to psychoanalysis. On the other hand, psychiatry is called to action just for cases of *schizophrenia* (-2.84), *anti-social troubles* (-2.43), *phobia* (-2.36) and *neurosis* (-2.13).

Active variables highlighted that **recurring to either psychoanalysis (1.38) or psychiatry (2.19) may be a double-face choice, revealing risky and helpful at the same time**, on the basis of the professional help and competence implied by the therapist's contribution.

Furthermore, **psychoanalysis is historically recognized as born in the XIX century (1.75)**, especially by high-educated participants, and it is not associated with a specific *age* to recur to (2.05), opposing the previously discussed association with *adulthood* (0.43). It is indicated as aiming at solving sentimental, familiar, social and adjustment problems, **providing a sort of “*chemin a deux*” between analyst and patient, both (0.86) actively involved in the healing process**.

3. “Dangerous methods”: nature and course of the therapist-patient relationship

S+ The positive semi-axes is delineated by responses mainly provided by *experts* (2.00), *experts in training* (4.79), and more specifically *psychiatrists* (2.37), *students in psychoanalytic* (2.76) and *psychiatric training* (2.99), hence characterized by a higher degree of education and exposition to specialistic knowledge. They are mostly non believers (2.17) and poorly interested in *religion* (2.74).

Such population of experts referred the following **terms to both disciplinary domains**, i.e. *conscious* (3.6), *neurosis* (3.45), *dream* (3.37), *symbol* (2.98), *indentification* (2.89), *transfert* (2.41), *phobia* (2.3), *psychosis* (2.24), *complex* (2.17), *thanatos* (2.15), *instinct* (2.13), *ego* (2.1), and *lapsus* (2.09). On the other hand, *thanatos* (2.71) and *repression* (2.36) still are acknowledged as heritage of the “**phylosophy of subject**” provided by the original Freudian theoretical proposal (Meyer, 2005).

This is in line with the **recent interchange between psychiatry and psychodynamic theories and approaches**, especially among European epistemic communities (Kandel, 2005), highlighting the latest contribution of psychoanalytic psychiatry and neuroscience in remodelling the image and the nature of modern psychoanalysis, so that traditional psychopathology is now object of redefinition under the influence of both new paradigms of mind functioning and the neurobiological approach to mental therapies (following the introduction of psychotropic drugs on the global market, see Jervis e Dazzi, 1999).



3. “Dangerous methods”: nature and course of the therapist- patient relationship

S- The negative semi-axis is delineated by responses provided by *lay participants* (-6.80) instead, *residing in Paris* (-3.25), especially *labourers* (-4.14), *professionals* (-2.72), *middle class individuals* (-2.05), mainly *catholics* (-2.93) and *believers* (-2.39). As regards the **thematic language** used, we found an underlying ambiguity and poor clarity, as expressions like *drive* (-2.65), *unconscious* (-2.24), *transfert* (-2.70), *free associations* (-2.63), *identification* (-2.28) and *projection* (-3.17), were not properly identified as belonging to a specific disciplinary field, and they were simply not recognized.

By means of such “**lay lenses**”, it is possible to observe differences to the previously described experts' perspectives. First, we found the contribution of active variables indicating a **high involvement by the patient within the therapeutic relationship** (1.12), perceived more as a **spiritual link** (1.08) rather than a health consultancy or intervention by a professional. Psychoanalysis is supposed to be recurred to about *twice a month* (0.55), *averagely* chosen by people in psychic difficulty (0.82).



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Part II

The Content Analysis of the Online Press



About the relevance of the online Press

Online newspapers and/or magazines are defined as those which exist on the World Wide Web, either separately or as an online version of a printed periodical (Schultz, 1999). They are different from the traditional ones to some salient aspects. In fact, under the influence of the Web 2.0 revolution, a new dimension of communication has progressively emerged, giving rise to new forms of interactive, ubiquitous and multi-actor models of information

The specific features that separate web and print media, traditional and online press, have been progressively included within an integrative framework, calling information agencies and readers to "juggle" among the paper and the web, to master several languages, in order to process information adapt it to different media

Although it is difficult to determine whether this structural change is uniform among national and cultural contexts (Carelli, 2004), characterized by different levels of contribution and access to information (Iannone, 2007), it is certain that these flows mark the boundaries of an irreversible transformation



Research Objectives and Hypothesis

- Investigate similarities and differences in comparison with the first-wave research (Moscovici, 1976), with special reference to the objects of analysis-representation investigated (see Moscovici, 1976)
- Verify the validity of Mosocovici's results related to the content of the representation investigated, expecting to confirm those findings providing psychoanalysis as as a system of interpretation and only incidentally as a specialised discipline – both as a theory and a technique – in the general context of newspapers and magazines. Conversely, we expected to find psychiatry represented as “official” science, acknowledged within and by society to master the field of mental health.
- Similarly, we expected that the figure of the psychiatrist would be assimilated the figure of "doctor", as placed in the professional field of medical science, considering psychiatry as "official", effective and institutionalized
- Examine expected variations in the communication systems, not just radically influenced by the ideologies representing the two political and ideological blocks (american capitalism vs communism) characterizing the socio-cultural scenario in which the first-wave research had been produced, hence mainly relying on the Diffusion of information rather than the orientation of attitudes and/or behaviours (as in the case of Propagation and Propaganda)

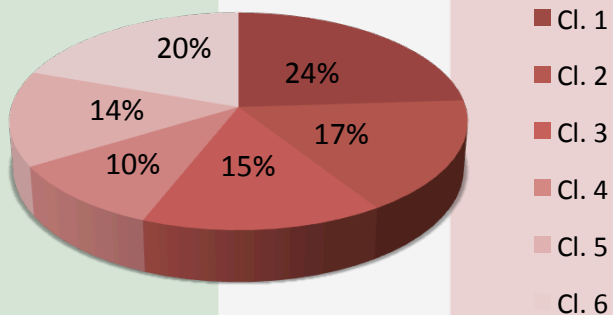

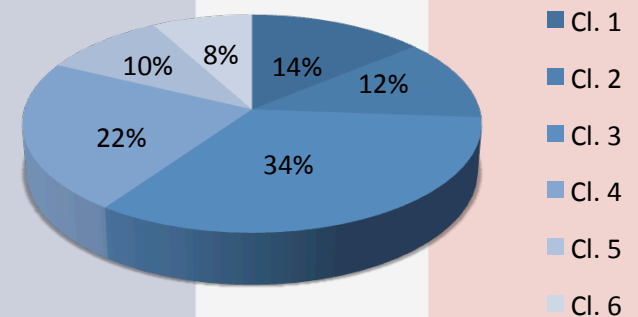

Social Networks: a Definition

“**Web-based services** that allow individuals to:

1. construct a **public or semi-public profile** within a bounded system
2. articulate a list of other **users** with whom they **share a connection**
3. view and traverse **their list of connections** and those made by others within the system

The nature and nomenclature of these connections may vary from site to site.”

(Boyd and Ellison, 2007, p. 2)

The relevance of the social networks is not only concerned with the so-called **snowball effect**, i.e. the exponential growth of their users, but the kind of social relations that they structure within them and the “**familiarity effect**” that they determine among their members. The kind of **trust** that they generate determines a sort of “**small world phenomenon**” , i.e. a relational and contrastive category of social-scientific interest (de Rosa, 2012)

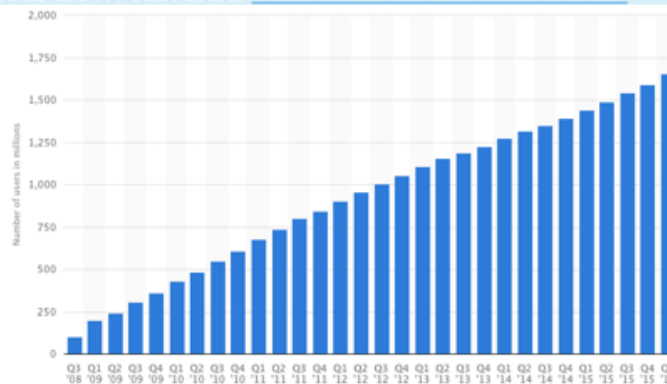

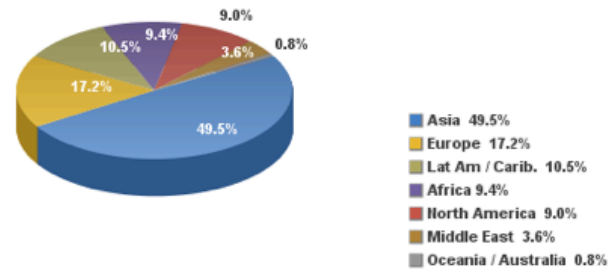

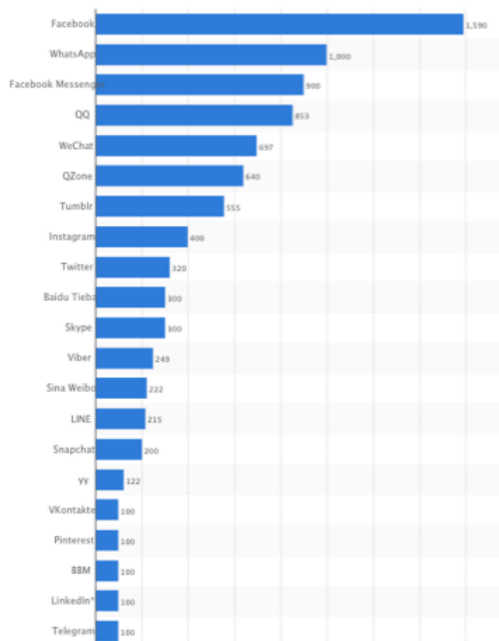

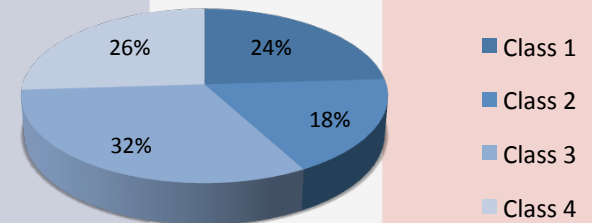

- From the FIELD STUDY, it emerges that the **Psychoanalysis** is anchored into a **more diffused lay knowledge system (very rarely psychoanalyst is still anchored into “priest” or “magical healer” of occultism).**
- However - in line with our preliminary hypothesis following the recent international debate of its scientific status and validity - **psychoanalysis appears as a discipline in decline.** In fact, we found it is **recognized as a theory, a current of thought, a historical cultural movement more than a practice or therapy, especially in the Italian vs. the French context**
- **In France the influence of Lacan clearly still emerges from our results, despite the controversial debate stimulated “in” and “by” the media by Onfray (2010) about the “affabulation” of the psychoanalysis , as testified by the results from the research lines focused on the media studies.**
- Differently, **psychiatry is perceived as a medical, natural science delegated to intervene in case of mental illness, providing pharmacologic and clinical solutions, as driven and legitimated by recent development of neurosciences, according to the advancement of a new image of mind and its functioning by means of an integration between psychodynamic study of the unconscious and neurobiological instances.**

Final Remarks:

The field of **mental health**, is nevertheless differentiated, according to each cultural context explored:

- **in France**, depicted as a **condition of individual deviance potentially attempting social security and order, to be contained in specialized hospitals and controlled by the psychiatry as tool of forensic law system to protect society;**
- **while in Italy**, intended as a **condition of suffering to be overcome by insertion in the context of community and socialized institutions,**

as an **outcome of different historical and cultural development in the public management and control of psychopathology**, according to the main effects of the so-called **Italian Basaglia Law (1978)** and the more recent reform on psychiatric hospitals approved by the **French Sarkozy government (2011)**.

Final Remarks:

From the MEDIA STUDIES on the press, as regards the systems of communication investigated, in comparison with Moscovici's fundamental classification, we found an evident decline of the propaganda and propagation, despite the emergence of the controversial dispute provoked by Onfray (2010) and the defence of the psychoanalysis by the professionals.

The decline of propaganda and propagation is likely to be explained at the light of our preliminary hypothesis regarding the decline of influence by the great ideologies prevalent in the twentieth century (including, mainly, the communist one, and the role of the Catholic church), replaced by the affirmation of socio-cultural milieus and lifestyles in guiding attitudes and behaviors of individuals and groups and by the emergence of the subjectivity especially in the realm of the social networks.

On the contrary, in regard to the **communication systems** Moscovici (1976, 1961), the **diffusion** is still substantially active and prevalent in contemporary media communication from our results from media studies research lines.

As argued by Moscovici, such system is not aiming to address and orientate attitudes, being **more inclined to confirm the reader's expectations**, according to a framework of equal relationship between broadcasting agency and receiver of the message.

We observe as **the contemporary press is characterized by a constant and specific proposal of images related to the domains of psychoanalysis, psychiatry and mental illness** that trace back representations which are commonly shared in society and especially lay environments, **operating within the boundaries of an apparently consensual universe**.

As regards from the social networks research lines, the main results show **the demand for mutual-help based on an intense exchange of subjective experiences among users, perceived as “friend’s community”**, in which the sharing of psychological, emotional and relational experiences serves to establish a fundamental dimension of socialization in the dynamics of communication implied.

We detect the emergence of a **specific style of communication characterizing the Web 2.0**, leading to the **substantial replacement of health tools and rehabilitation paths, as well as the institutional roles of professionals themselves** (such as, for example, psychiatrists, psychoanalysts and psychotherapists), with a specific form of informal, mutual support, based on emotional and experiential sharing: “from the coach of the psychoanalyst to the psychiatric – aid of the imagined friends in the social networks”.

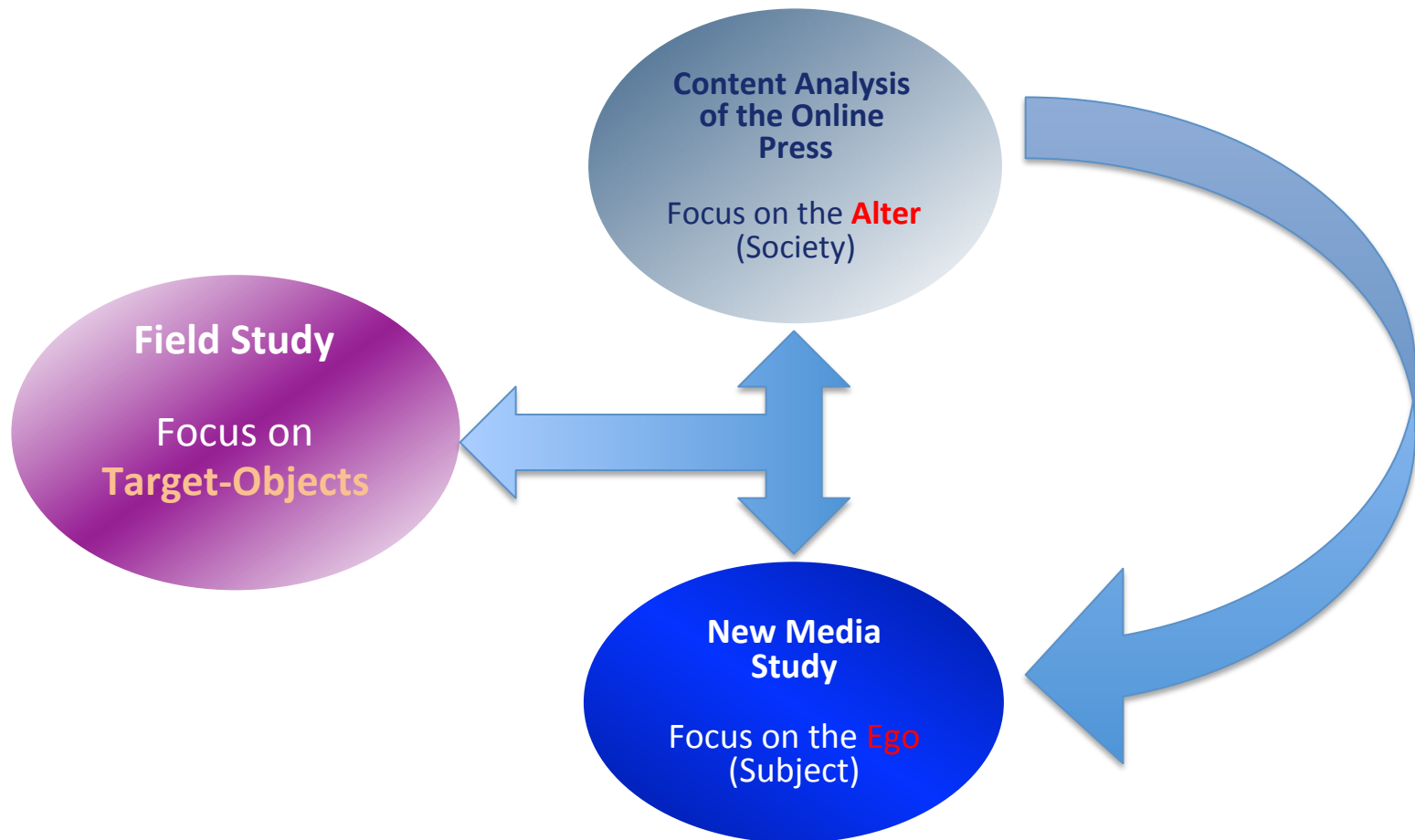

In conclusion, the results obtained from the three research lines implemented in the context of the present study, allowed us to identify **the advent of a new “naive theory of mind” and to trace its boundaries.**

The three integrated research lines have detected **the complex interrelated systems of representations which characterize the objects of knowledge considered:** psychoanalysis, psychiatry, mental health and their practices in two geo-cultural and normative contexts .

Fifty years away from the historic and seminal research by Moscovici on the “level of penetration of psychoanalysis in French society” (ibid.), we have tried to shed light on the **emerging fragmentation of knowledge and the further articulation of communication systems in different styles and objectives.**

The results highlight the existing delimitation of theories, methods and scientific practices, as dominated by a **substantial and extended cognitive polyphasia**, remarking the centrality of social representations as a powerful tool for the exploration and interpretation of the social world, to which the modeling approach applied sought to pursue.





Final remarks

- Aware of the temerity of the intellectual enterprise, our hope in this audacious attempt to have at least understood the **desire for continuity** with which Moscovici says his own work in post-faction ***"The work of science is never done and its virtue lies in its start."***
- Our research aims to honor the fertility inspiring the ***Opera Prima***, that rightly Gerard Duveen (2008) valued as follows: **"It is a classic text, but not the kind of store shelves of a library (...)** Rather, it is a text that should be of interest to contemporary social psychologists and attract their attention"

In accordance with the Opera Prima and its author, "we have conducted this research with the humility of the performer of a famous symphony, which does not pretend to recreate, but to renew the pleasure of play it back, updating it with some variation on the theme" (de Rosa, 2011).
