Annual Conference Conflict in Identities, Identities in Conflict



The Masaryk University's Department of Sociology and its Center for Cultural Sociology would like to inform all partner universities about an annual conference *Conflict in Identities, Identities in Conflict*, held yearly at the Masaryk University in Brno, Czech Republic, every third weekend of October. The aim of the conference is to discuss the concept of identity in a broad variety of contexts (for example, nationality, religion, ethnicity, gender, generations, and class, and also memory, social rituals, everyday encounters, the arts, consumption, etc.), and to test the concept's analytical power and limitations.

This year, the ninth round of the conference has been held on October 16-17, and has hosted well established as well as young scholars from universities of four Continents. Over the years, it has acquired international reputation for its time-generous workshop-like arrangement (60 minutes for each paper), flexible format, and intellectually stimulating atmosphere. It brings together scholars from different fields of social sciences – sociology, psychology, political science, anthropology, cultural studies, history, philosophy, etc. – and thus provides a multidisciplinary forum for critical examination of the analytical value and use of the concepts of social and cultural representations, among other related topics. Each year, two or three places – out of twelve maximum – are reserved for PhD research trainees.

The theory of social representations means a change in the understanding of social behaviour and practices and represents a crossroads for the social sciences. Man does not only react to objective reality, but to a collective and socially reconstructed one.
