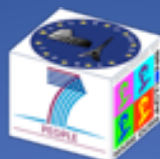

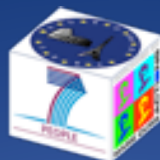
### So.Re.Com. Joint-IDP: activity report for month 19 (April 2015)

### The So.Re.Com. Joint-IDP Early-Stage Researchers Activities – April 2015

The month of April 2015 has started with the Italian national holiday for the Easter break. After reopening of the lab, all trainees have continued to work on **meta-theoretical analysis**, based on the Excel grids organized by research focus and individual separate folders with PDFs for each research focus. Moreover, some of the trainees have also dedicated their time and effort to a careful check of the data that is going to be imported to the virtual library. In particular, concerning the authors' institutions and countries, a decision has been made to acquire a specific database in order to proceed in a synchronized way.

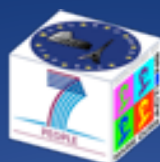
**Teresa Forte**, the new early stage researcher from Portugal, dedicated to the research focus on **Mapping the impact and dissemination of the social representation theory across different geo-cultural contexts: “Latin America”, the most fertilised scenario**, who has just recently joined the program has quickly become integrated in the lab. Besides receiving the individual training and undertaking the task of meta-theoretical analysis of social representations literature in Portuguese, she has also performed some other tasks related to the theoretical preparation.

**Luana Vilas Boas** from the **State University of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil** has been working at the European/International Joint PhD in Social Representations & Communication Research Center and Multimedia Lab on a daily basis, contributing to the meta-theoretical analysis of the literature on social representations and health, in particular the publications related to her research topic.

On April 9-10, 2015 **Prof. Annamaria Silvana de Rosa** and **Filomena Berardi** attended an international conference organized by the Institute of Psychology, University of Pécs, in the framework of **Cost Action IS1205 “Social psychological dynamics of historical representations in the enlarged European Union”**, entitled **“Social Representations of History: Social psychological and historical approaches to their antecedents, evolution, and role in influencing identities and intergroup relations”**. Prof. de Rosa has presented three contributions. The conference has constituted an opportunity for networking and a deeper understanding of the thematic field of social representations, politics and identity.



## The So.Re.Com Joint-IDP Activities



On April 16, 2015 **Prof. Pedrinho Guareschi** (from **Universidade Federal do Rio Grande Do Sul, FRGS, Brazil**) has made his conclusive remarks as a visiting professor to the doctoral trainees.

By April 25, **Prof. Annamaria Silvana de Rosa** has submitted the annual scientific and administrative documentation in order to ensure the continuity of the accreditation of the doctoral program by the Italian Ministry of Education (MIUR). She has also kept in frequent contact with different partners, while working on this submission and making decisions concerning the program sustainability in accordance to the criteria settled by the **MIUR** in the Guidelines March 24, 2014 and the new documents of the **ANVUR** (National Agency for the Evaluation of Universities and Research institutes) for the evaluation of the doctorates (December 15, 2014 and January, 7 2015).

The **SoReCom Joint-IDP trainees** have integrated their career plans within and beyond the temporal frame (3-5 years) of their contract to be evaluated and approved by the project leader and the Sapienza Supervisor Board in a special meeting planned for May 19, before proceeding to the renewal of their contract on the basis of their first year reports and the confirmation of their commitment to accomplish the SoReCom Joint –IDP project tasks and training activities according to the contractual timeline, to be able to achieve their PhD by 3 years.

Finally, the month of April has culminated with the **27th International Lab Meeting - Spring Session 2015** that took place on April 27-29, 2015 at the dedicated lab infrastructure in Rome.

## Scientific Events on Social Representations– April 2015

### *Social representations of history: Social psychological and historical approaches to their antecedents, evolution, and role in influencing identities and intergroup relations*

Organized by COST Action IS1205  
University of Pécs, Hungary, April 9-10th, 2015

This international conference was organized by the Institute of Psychology, University of Pécs, in the framework of **Cost Action IS1205** “Social psychological dynamics of historical representations in the enlarged European Union”. As introduction, **Denis Hilton** and **James H. Liu** presented a keynote lecture “**Telling Histories: A Tribute to János László’s “Science of Stories”**”.

The international conference was focused on the relevance of history in contemporary people’s lives. How history is being represented contributes to shaping current ethnic, national and European identities. Representations of history elicit group-based emotions that influence behaviours and may lead to intergroup conflicts or reconciliation in Europe and beyond.

The scientific focus of the conference revolves around **three major fundamental ideas**. **Firstly**, our relation with the world is built on representations that are shaped and shared within social groups. These representations are not only responsible for our knowledge of the present, but also of the past and future. **Secondly**, our knowledge about the world is intertwined with our identities; who we are as individuals or as group members. **Thirdly**, our representations of past intergroup relations, especially conflicts, weigh on current intergroup (e.g. interethnic or international) relations. As a consequence, the transmission of historical narratives, especially about past intergroup conflicts, is crucial in facilitating or impeding reconciliation processes.

A two days workshop on Social Representations Theory has been organized by the **Consortium of Psiko- Kultural Indonesia**, consisted of three Psychology Faculties from **Universitas Sumatra Utara- Medan** (North Sumatra), **Universitas Andalas-Padang** (West Sumatra), **Universitas Katholik Indonesia Atma Jaya-Jakarta**, and the **Robert Lemelson Foundation-USA**, in Jakarta **at Universitas Katholik Indonesia Atmajaya Jakarta**, the **13<sup>th</sup> and the 14<sup>th</sup> of April 2015**.

The workshop was directed by **Dr. Risa Permanadeli**, the Director of Center of Social Representations Studies Indonesia, presenting the theory and it's various researches done in the Indonesian Cultural Context. The consortium which was formed a year ago has its aim to be a Centre of Excellence in understanding the Indonesian society's mentality due to its great diversity in socio-cultural and long historical background. 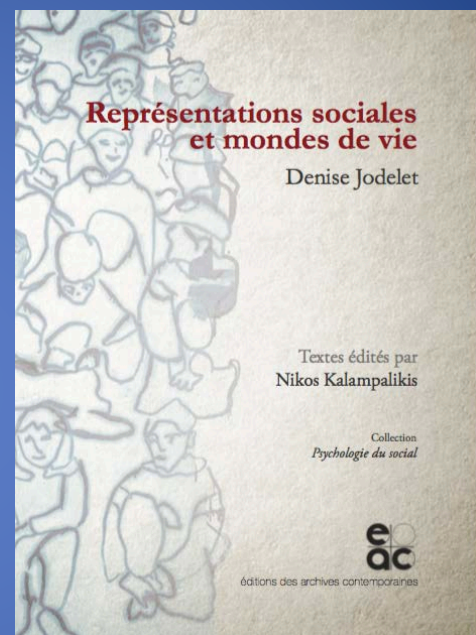
## New Publications on Social Representations

### *Représentations sociales et mondes de vie*

Denise Jodelet

Textes édités par Nikos Kalampalikis

The present work, edited by **Nikos Kalampalikis**, brings together for the first time some of **Denise Jodelet's essential texts**; except for the creation of the Social Psychology laboratory from EHESS in 1965, her works have impacted the field of social representations in an unparalleled way. The uniqueness of this volume lies in the fact that it gives an overview of the developments which have been made in the empirical and theoretical research practice over the past 30 years, and, as such, it has provided new perspectives over the delicate matters of our world which relate directly to the field of Social Psychology.



What we discover here is an original contribution covering representative phenomena - objects of social representations - examined from multiple points of view. **From the epistemological viewpoint**, they are put in relation with other social sciences. **From the perspective of their social character**, the volume advances an analysis of the socio-cognitive processes which participate in their construction. **From the perspective of their social relevance**, it facilitates the understanding of the symbolic processes related to the individuals' multiple and simultaneous belonging to several social groups, and the understanding of the symbolic processes related to the common social heritage of individuals and groups, both historically and culturally. **From the perspective of their empirical application**, it examines topics like memory, the urban environment, health, the body, gender, the environment. In terms of **proposals for future research**, it suggests further exploring psychological dimensions still little considered by social representations, it advances the following domains for further investigation: otherness, experience, subjectivity, imagination, affectivity and emotions.
