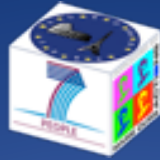
"Marie Skłodowska-Curie Individual Fellowships (IF) 2015" 2nd of July 2015

Although the **Early Stage Researchers** were all very busy for the preparation of the Mid Term Meeting and the Summer School, given the prospective interest for their future career plan - after completing their PhD, those of them who were interested in **applying for a MSC IF post-doc position** in the future and who were able to follow the session in Italian attended the morning session of the Information day.

As in the last month, the task of carefully checking the data and meta-data that is going to be imported to the SoReCom “A.S. de Rosa” @-library was continued in view of the new massive data import.

Moreover, in **preparation for the secondment** that begun last month, some of the Early Stage Researchers have simultaneously worked **on scanning some of the books and papers** from their individual lists of publications to be meta-analyzed during the secondment period.

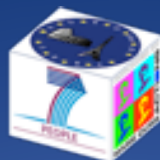
