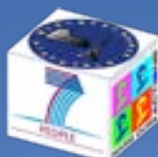

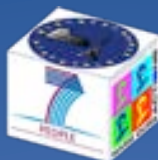

3rd Meeting of the Integrated Sapienza Supervisory Board February 1, 2016

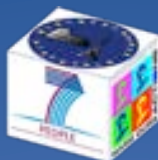

Annamaria de Rosa spent an intensive and fruitful Saturday on February 6 in Paris, meeting three well known colleagues with long term collaboration and associated partners:

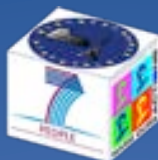

Round Table Abstract Submission XIII ICSR in Marseille

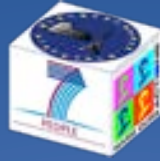


On February 28, 2016 Prof. de Rosa has completed the submission of all abstracts of the Round table “**Serge Moscovici’s supra-disciplinary power of thinking**”, for the XIII International Conference on Social Representations in September 2016 in Marseille. It will be articulated in two interrelated sessions, each of them with 4 contributions (according to the rules of the conference) by 25 researchers from 12 countries in 3 languages (English, French and Spanish).

The **first session** will be more focused on various epistemological views on Moscovici’s thinking, moving from history of science and ecology to his latest interest for the value systems and the "historic ethics" dimension of the victimhood phenomena. a meta-theoretical systematic analysis of the development of various paradigmatic approaches generated by the social representation theory and of its concurrent interest for many diversified thematic areas of societal interest. It will include:

- a contribution entitled "From Kepler to Moscovici" by **Jorge Jesuino** (I.S.C.T.E:-IUL, Portugal) moving from history of science to the various disciplinary paths crossed by Moscovici in his work;
- a contribution entitled “Un nouveau regard sur les phénomènes victimaires » by **Denise Jodelet** (E.H.E.S.S., France) on the echoes of the latest works of Moscovici on values and victimization in social sciences and studies on political memory and repentance,
- two integrated lab team's presentations based on empirical data built through the meta-theoretical analyses, respectively focused on:
 - "The generativity of the social representation theory for multiple paradigmatic approaches along different decades and across various geo-cultural contexts-continents" by **de Rosa, A.S. 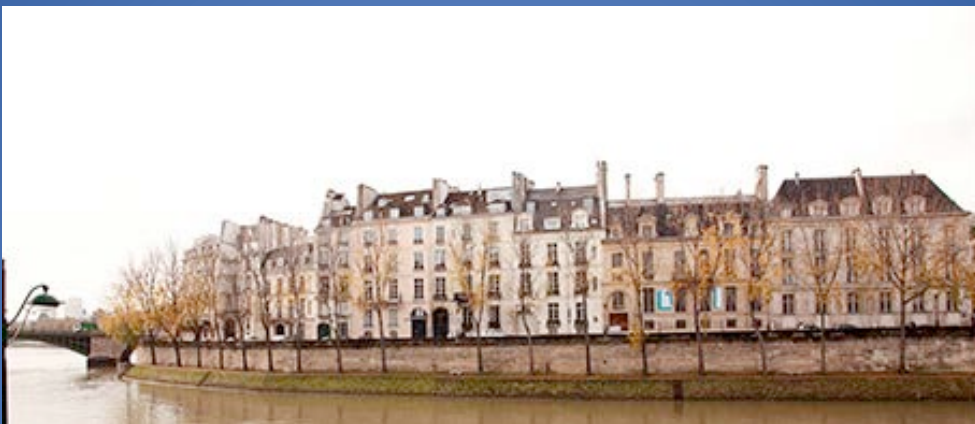
