# Individual meetings of the ESRs with their main tutor, some co-tutors and lab assistant May 11, 2016

SoReCom Joint-IDP ESRs have had supervisory meetings with the Project Leader Prof. Annamaria de Rosa, some of their co-tutors and lab assistant, aimed :

a) to share awareness about the need of the current phase aimed at assigning the references according to cross-thematic and crosscategorical criteria (es. geo-cultural, paradigmatic, thematic) in order to proceed to the multiple use of the same references by more than one fellows and to exchange sources initially assigned by using one exclusive criteria, therefore proceeding to a fair redistribution of the sources:

b) to start to introduce one-by-one the methodological training on the application of Iramuted on the set of data built on the bibliographic items of the sources that are currently under metatheoretical analysis, using abstracts and key words as active variables and many variables of the bibliographic items as "illustrative variables".

The strategy of "learning by doing" and individual one-to-one training to be provided in the next months at the European/Int. Joint PhD in S.R. & C. Research Centre and Multimedia Lab is in line with the already announced plan, when updating the new individual ESRs' Table on Main Activities which have all in common the plan to participate in further applied statistical training on Iramuteg and on Multidimensional Analysis of Correspondence.



The new book by Sergio Salvatore (University of Salento) entitled *Psychology in Black and White: The Project of a Theory-Driven Science* has been published within the series *Advances in Cultural Psychology: Constructing Human Development* (Editor(s): Jaan Valsiner, *Niels Bohr Professor of Cultural Psychology, Aalborg University*).

This book is long awaited within the contemporarily creative field of cultural psychologies. It is a theoretical synthesis that is at the level of innovations that Sigmund Freud, James Mark Baldwin, William Stern, Kurt Lewin, Jean Piaget, Lev Vygotsky and Jan Smedslund have brought into psychology over the past century.

Here we can observe a creative solution to integrating cultural psychology with the rich traditions of psychodynamic perspectives, without repeating the conceptual impasses in which many psychoanalytic perspectives have become caught.
